The SimplyE & Palace Project Overview

What is SimplyE?

<u>SimplyE</u> is a library-developed, open source eBook/eAudiobook app that simplifies the experience of finding, borrowing and accessing library eBooks and eAudiobooks. It is vendor/publisher agnostic, meaning libraries can aggregate content from various sources and share with patrons in one singular e-reader.

Early Development/History

- Library Simplified was developed in 2012 by The New York Public Library and nine partners with ILMS grant funds. In 2015 a larger group of libraries joined and expanded the Library Simplified work and they called themselves the Library E-Content Access Project (LEAP).
 - Library Simplified is a collection of middleware, server software, collections management tools and mobile client applications for iOS and Android that libraries use to deliver e-books and audiobooks to their patrons. It is designed to be integrated with existing technologies and systems common to libraries such as an Integrated Library System/Library Management Systems (ILS/LMS), Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) or Single Sign On (SSO) credential management system. It connects to commercial ebook hosting and distribution services such as Overdrive, Baker & Taylor's Axis360, bibliotheca's cloudLibrary, and Digital Rights Management products such as Adobe, LCP and Findaway.
 - SimplyE is the free-to-use e-reader that library patrons download to their mobile devices and use to browse, borrow and read library e-books. It is the end-user interface of the Library Simplified suite of software tools that libraries can use to manage their ebook and audiobook collections.
- New York Public was the first to launch the SimplyE app in 2016.
- 3 consortia host and implement the SimplyE platform for libraries: Amigos, Califa, and Lyrasis
- SimplyE is compatible with most library e-book and audiobook providers, including:
 - Baker & Taylor Axis360
 - cloudLibrary by Bibliotheca
 - DPLA Exchange
 - EBSCO NoveList
 - BiblioBoard
 - \circ Odilo
 - o OverDrive
 - RBDigital audiobooks and ebooks
- SimplyE reads Adobe PDFs, plays audiobooks, does not read Kindle Books or work on e-ink devices.
- Over 400 libraries are set up for SimplyE but over 3/4 of them are still in the "sandbox" stage and are not live.

Current State of Affairs

- June 2021, Lyrasis and DPLA announced a split from SimplyE and the creation of their own project, <u>the Palace Project</u>, funded by a \$5 million investment by the Knight Foundation.
- New York Public Library will continue to use and develop SimplyE.
- The Palace Project provides access to open content for free through the <u>DPLA Exchange</u> and <u>Open Bookshelf</u>.

- Lyrasis uses the SimplyE opensource software and will develop it for the Palace Project. As of now, Lyrasis will be the only host of the Palace Project.
- The Palace Project will include the following:
 - The Palace App A free patron-facing ereading application for iOS and Android launching in Fall of 2021.
 - Palace Circulation Manager Software that connects a library's book collections with the patron-facing Palace app, handling authentication and combines vendor purchased materials with open-access materials.
 - Marketplace The DPLA Exchange is a non-profit ebook and audiobook marketplace.
 Titles from major publishers and dozens of independent publishers, as well as Amazon Publishing, are available in the DPLA Exchange.
 - Exclusive Amazon content from Amazon's self publishing division to be offered for purchase: <u>https://amazonpublishing.amazon.com/</u>
 - Implementation and Hosting Lyrasis will provide implementation and hosting services through Amazon Web Services.
