 - i. New look for OverDrive?
 OverDrive has sent WiLS some examples of new looks for the OverDrive site. Is the Board interested in pursuing a new look for the OverDrive site?
 - ii. Weeding OverDrive Collection

The Selection Committee remains convinced that weeding is necessary even when shelf space is not an issue. Slogging through a long list of items is hard; overdrive does not have the best searching functionality. Titles identified for weeding include low use and out of date items. <u>Committee would like Board approval to proceed</u>

iii. Expanding the selection process as a way to increase funding

As a way of increasing the funds available for Overdrive content, WiLS proposes an expansion of the selection process to potentially involve more libraries. Each System could have its own selection process - which would include a liaison from the Selection Committee as a guide - to choose titles for the collection.....and provide the funds to pay for the titles of their choosing. Ordering would still be done centrally and the Selection Committee would review the content to assure consistency with selection policy and avoid duplication. Our thinking is that perhaps individual libraries would be more likely to contribute additional funds for Overdrive content if they were able to actually choose their own titles. We ask for Board consideration of this plan

iv. Scrolling collections

Scrolling collections allow users to see more titles that are within a collection at your homepage, we can add scrolling arrows to the left and right of the collection. When a user clicks on the arrow, a new set of titles will be displayed. Example: http://ebooks.kcls.org

v. Log-in process

This request came from a participating library: "Can we get the user log-in process with OverDrive improved? Currently, the user has to select their Library System and then log-in with card number If a list of libraries (sorted by city) were available, like when signing into Badgerlink, that could simplify one of the many steps needed to get book downloaded.

Many users don't know what system they belong to. Logging in, checking out, downloading, and transferring files already requires several steps. I'd like to simplify that first step if possible."

vi. *OverDrive support*

Form for patrons to complete when seeking support. Concept is to automatically forward to the appropriate Partner Support person; WiLS would be default.

WiLS is currently doing survey of Support people to get their thoughts. Results should be ready by Board meeting

b) NetLibrary

i. Weeding netLibrary

The Selection Committee reconsidered, as requested, the recommendation for weeding all non-down-loadable titles from the WPLC NetLibrary Collection - and came to the same conclusion.

Nothing has been added to this collection since at least 2003, content is old and format is not what people are asking for. It should be withdrawn. The Committee is going to review the down-loadable titles in the collection, item by item, to determine if any of this content should also be weeded.

There are only 550 of these while there are over 4,000 non down-loadable titles
