The History of the WPLC

The <u>Wisconsin Public Library Consortium</u> (WPLC) was formed in 2001 as an organization in Wisconsin where library systems could partner on projects that move libraries forward through experimentation and R&D. Let's take a brief walk through the history of the WPLC, which has at its center, Wisconsin's Digital Library.





WPLC Timeline

2003 : Shared collection began with audiobooks from NetLibrary 2005: First order of audiobooks placed with OverDrive 2009: First ebook order placed in October 2009 2010: Shared Collection Budget is \$92K annually



WPLC Evolution Timeline

⇒ **2011** was a busy year for the WPLC

May: Statewide Ebook Summit

July: Committee formed to discuss feasibility of a statewide buying pool for the WPLC





Results of the Statewide Ebook Summit: Formation of the Digital Media Buying Pool

WPLC creates committee charged with developing a funding mechanism for a digital media buying pool as a result of ebook summit recommendations, May, 2011 Committee recommends:

- \$1,000,000 statewide pool (5% of statewide materials expenditures for 2009)
- Fund at system level based on 50% of system share based on population 50% of system share based on usage



Further WPLC Development

2012: Digital Media Buying Pool is approved at \$1 million

2012: Statewide Selection Committee of 2 members per system is formed
2013: WPLC Digital Steering Committee is formed

- Comprised of members from each library system with a max of 25 members.
- Makes budget and policy recommendations related to Wisconsin's Digital Library to the WPLC Board for approval, and makes all decisions relating to the day-to-day operation of the Digital Library.



Expanding Possibilities

2015: Newspaper Digitization Project began with a pilot

2016: Local Historical Collections Committee formed

2019: <u>WPLC Roundtable</u> held in to provide an opportunity for members to meet face to face

2021: Technology Collaborative was established.



A Home For Technology Collaborations

- Arose out of a need for a governance home for two system backup projects that emerged out of SRLAAW
- Public Library System Redesign effort played in encouraging statewide technology collaborations through its technology workgroup report produced in April 2018.
- There was a need for a more permanent governance structure for both of these projects, and the WPLC was tapped as the ideal home

for these projects and any future shared technology project



The Purpose of the WPLC

- Sharing costs and decision-making to support public library cooperation
- Providing Wisconsin citizens with access to a robust digital collection
- Undertake collaborative services or projects concerned with the advancement of public libraries
- Increase **public awareness** of the Consortium's resources
- Increase stakeholder understanding of Consortium projects
 through training
