WPLC Governance

Each public library system has a seat on the Board, the main governing body of the WPLC. Other committees and workgroups:

- Digital Library Steering Committee manages the operation of Wisconsin's Digital Library.
- Selection Committee chooses and buys content for the digital library.
- Collection Development Workgroup evaluates the composition of the digital collection with particular attention to known concerns and potential additions to the collection.
- Historical and Local Digital Collections Committee considers ways to leverage collaboration to foster enhanced digital access and preservation services for historical and local digital collections and maintains the historical newspaper project.
